Female voice: Let's take a look at what some credit unions are doing in their local communities!

Female voice: American Heritage CU, in Philadelphia, Pa., partnered with 98.1 WOGL to host a Member Appreciation Day along with the 18th Annual Car Show, which raised a total of \$25,000 for the Kids-N-Hope Foundation.

Female voice: In Corry, Pa., Corry Jamestown CU presented two scholarships for \$500 to two local high school students.

Female voice: Down in Roanoke, Va., Blue Eagle CU gave ten \$1,000 scholarships to students to help them pay for their higher education.

Female voice: Choice One Community CU in Wilkes-Barre, Pa., donated \$1,500 to Fork Over Love, and together, with 15 employees from Choice One, bought 250 hot meals from small restaurants and distributed them to people in their community.

Female voice: Down in Lancaster, S.C., Founders FCU provided a \$500,000 commitment to the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) Foundation for MUSC's transplant program, which provides life-saving services to people in the community.

Female voice: PSECU in Harrisburg, Pa., awarded six \$8,000 scholarships for its 26th Annual Scholarship Program to help graduating high school seniors pay for postsecondary education.

Female voice: In Charlottesville, Va., UVA Community CU presented 23 high school seniors with \$1,500 in scholarship funds.

Female voice: Coastal CU's foundation, in Raleigh, N.C., provided \$5,000 grants to 19 nonprofit organizations within their community.

Female voice: Ten teachers in Greenville, S.C., received grants from Greenville FCU to fund projects and pay for any needs that they may have during the 2022-2023 school year.

Female voice: USSCO, in Johnstown, Pa., awarded scholarships to four graduating seniors in the amount of \$1,500.

Female voice: Down in Arlington, Va., Arlington Community FCU gave \$30,000 to three Northern Virginia organizations that are dedicated to providing solutions for housing, professional development and financial education to their communities.

Female voice: Mountain Credit Union in Waynesville, N.C. joined forces with MANNA Food Bank and provided 1,468 pounds of food and over \$550 to the Food Bank in order to provide meals to those in need throughout the community.

Female voice: In Grove City, Pa., Grove City Area FCU held a school supply drive to help children and families in need with school supplies.

Female voice: Through employees and the Casual for a Cause initiative, Riverfront FCU in Wyomissing, Pa., provided the funds needed for toiletries and supplies for children and mothers at Safe Berks, a safe haven for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault.

Female voice: Congratulations and thank you to all the credit unions mentioned today. Great Job! You are difference makers!

Female voice: And here at home, Vizo Financial, was a Victory Lane sponsor of the 2022 Run to Victory 5K/10K/fun run event to benefit Victory Junction, and a team of Vizo Financial staff members participated in the walk/run/roll event as well!
